Cedar Park is the third largest city in the Austin metropolitan area, known for its outstanding schools, pro-business climate and relaxed family environment. Named one of Family Circle's Top 10 Places to Raise a Family, Cedar Park offers all the benefits of life in the beautiful Texas Hill Country, with desirable neighborhoods, an entrepreneurial business environment, and an effective, conservatively managed city government. Cedar Park is part of the Austin-Round Rock MSA (population 2.227 million\*), the fourth largest region in the state of Texas. Cedar Park is located in western Williamson County (population estimate 566,719\*) and northeastern Travis County, one of the fastest-growing areas in the Region.

Cedar Park is located in the Texas Hill Country with an elevation of 906 ft. The climate is classified as humid subtropical, with hot summers and mild, typically dry winters. Freezing temperatures occur only about 25 days per year. While summer days are hot, summer nights are usually pleasant. There are 111 days each year with temperatures above 90 °F, usually from June until September. Austin receives 31.35 in. of rain per year, with most of the precipitation in the spring.



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# **2020 POPULATION BYEDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT**





### MAJOR ROADWAYS SERVING CEDAR PARK

U.S. HIGHWAY 183A 183A was the first toll road opened by the Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority in 2005, and its ongoing success led to to completion of the northern extension.

### AIR SERVICE

Austin-Bergstrom International Airport is only 28 miles from Cedar Park, and has non-stop service to 61 cities, including 10 international locations in Mexico, Canada, and Europe on the following passenger airlines: AeroMexico, Air Canada, Alaska Airlines, Allegiant Air, American Airlines, British Airlines, Continental Airlines, Delta Air Lines, Frontier Airlines, JetBlue Airways, KLM Royal Dutch Airlines, Lufthansa, Norwegian Air, Southwest Airlines, Spirit Airlines, Sun Country Airlines, United Airlines, Vacation Express and West Jet.

### AIR CARGO SERVICES

ABIA's cargo facilities are strategically located near a 12,250 ft. long runway and next to Texas State Highway 71, just minutes of IH-35. Air cargo providers include: Amazon Air, Baron Aviation Service, Fed Ex, PHL Express, Telesis Express and UPS.

The \$55 million H-E-B Center at Cedar park is a city owned multi-purpose event venue located at the corner of New Hope Drive and the 183A Toll Road. The Center has 6,800 fixed suites, 24 luxury suites and two party suites. The venue hosts everything from professional sports play to family entertainment and even high school graduations. The Texas Stars, the AHL affiliate of the Dallas Stars Hockey Team as well as the Austin Spurs, NBA Development League team of the San Antonio Spurs both play all of their home games at the H-E-B Center. Since the H-E-B Center opened with a sold-out George Strait concert in 2009, it has also hosted numerous family events from Disney on Ice, circuses and rodeos, and many other events.



### HOUSING

Housing construction is a common sight in Cedar Park and careful consideration has been given to provide greenbelts and hike and bike trails in most neighborhoods.
